READING TOGETHER 2023 IMPACT REPORT

With the help of volunteer mentors, Reading Together provides positive, consistent mentoring relationships in a safe learning environment for students to practice reading, connect with books they love, and improve literacy skills.

Six library locations host mentors and students who meet with each other weekly throughout the school year to spark the joy of literacy through reading, relationship-building, and creative play.

In 2023, SPPL offered additional learning games for Reading Together pairs to use that supported literacy and led to increased enthusiasm and engagement.
